

School Choice

Schools enrolled in Program Improvement (PI) schools have the option to transfer to schools in the LEA that are not PI, with paid transportation.

Under Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA), students who attend a Title I-funded school that is identified for program improvement, corrective action, or restructuring must be given the option of school choice. This provision allows all students attending such a Title I school the option to transfer to another public school, including a public charter school, that is within the LEA and that is not in program improvement or is not persistently dangerous.

Supplemental Educational Services (SES)

The No Child Left Behind (NCLB) Act of 2001 enables parents to select supplemental educational services for their children.

Supplemental educational services (SES) are additional academic instruction provided outside of the regular school day and designed to increase the academic achievement of students attending schools in Program Improvement (PI) Years 2 through 5. SES, or free tutoring, must be high quality; research based, and specifically designed to increase student academic achievement. Eligible students are all low-income students who attend Title I PI Years 2 through 5 schools.

Participation Data (PI)

The No Child Left Behind (NCLB) Act of 2001 requires the Valley Home Joint School District to post participation data for Program Improvement (PI) programs. The following table includes the number of students eligible for Public School Choice and Supplemental Educational Services (SES), as well as the number of students who participated.
